Health and Devotion

Spring Cleaning Your Plate!

Spring is coming and so is a new crop of fresh produce. Look for "in season" fruits and veggies for the most nutritional value at the farmer's market or grocery store.

Here is a sampling of some of the produce to watch for in March, April and May.

- Asparagus - Delicious roasted, grilled or lightly sautéed in olive oil.
- Artichokes - Bake and toss in pastas or salads.
- Apricots - Rinse and enjoy for a sweet treat.
- Broccoli - This vitamin rich vegetable is great in stir-fry, steamed or grated into slaw.
- Butter Lettuce - Boston and Bibb lettuce fall into this category of greens with a slightly sweet buttery taste.
- Honeydew Melon - Store at room temperature until slicing. Mix with finely chopped red onion, fresh cilantro and a squeeze of lime juice for a fresh melon salsa.
- Jackfruit - Rich in fiber and the largest fruit to grow on a tree. Vegetarians enjoy it as the perfect substitute for pulled beef.
- Pineapple - Choose fruit with dark green leaves and avoid ones with soft or dark spots and dry looking leaves.
- Spinach - Add to salads, omelets, or sauté with garlic and olive oil.
- Strawberries - Taste great whole, sliced in cereal or added to a fruit salad.
- Watercress - Flavorful green to add to sandwiches, soups or mixed into salads.

Devotional Thought: Death on the Cross

For the children of Israel, death on the cross held great significance. God told Moses that criminals who were found to be guilty of a capital crime and who were executed by death on a "tree" were to be considered "accursed of God."

Everybody believed that to be true. This teaching explains why the Jewish rulers begged Pilate to have Jesus crucified rather than stoned. They believed that if they could get Jesus crucified, His fellow citizens would forever consider Him to be cursed by God.

In the Garden of Eden, God told Adam and Eve that sin would mean death because sin is lethal. Just as the roots of a full-grown tree reach deep down into the earth, sin reaches deep within us, permeating our very being. We can find deliverance from sin only by seeing what the Son of God had to suffer in order to pay its penalty, and by trusting that His death, even death on a cross, is sufficient to save us.

Orange Cove Core Values: To Be a Mature Disciple...

- 1. Refresh:** Be "Refreshed" by the baptism of the Holy Spirit moment by moment. "For John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized by the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Acts 1:5. Jesus dwells in the hearts of His Children through His Spirit. By asking Him, after receiving forgiveness, the Holy Spirit comes and lives in us—His holy temples.
- 2. Abide:** Jesus said, "I am the Vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me, you can do nothing." John 15:5. It is through the Word that Christ abides in His followers. Spending time alone with God before the day starts in Bible study, prayer and meditation gives Divine power and strength through the Spirit to those who do it.
- 3. Share:** The example of the early Christian Church in Acts 2 demonstrates how God intended for believers to meet together in church (large groups) and homes (small groups). Meeting together & sharing, ingrains the truth of God's Word and the teachings of Jesus in the believers' lives.
- 4. Give:** God invites all His disciples to give of their time and their means to further His Kingdom. "Do not lay up for yourselves treasure on earth . . . lay up for yourselves treasure in heaven." Matt 6:19. Giving allows a disciple to participate in God's Holy Nature and neutralize the selfish tendencies within his or her sinful nature.
- 5. Mentor:** The great controversy between good and evil is fierce and complex. God ordained believers to encourage, support and care for one another in close, "family-like," relationships. Every disciple should be mentored by a more mature, experienced disciple and should, in turn, mentor a less experienced younger disciple than themselves. This process solidifies the experience of each disciple.
